PLAN FOR SPORTS PREMIUM FUNDING 2016/17

As of September 2016 Raynville Primary School has again received additional Sports premium funding to improve the quality of sport and PE for all their children. Sport Premium is an amount of money which the government has agreed to allocate to schools to increase the quality & breadth of PE & Sport provision, and increase participation in PE & Sport.

This year we will look to further increase our participation in sport, providing a border range of opportunities for pupils in the wider school community, cluster and the city. We are also looking to raise standards, attainment and progress of all pupils within the curriculum. Moreover, we strive to promote healthy and active lifestyles for all our children.

As such we have felt the sports premium funding is best utilised in the following areas to support the school development of PE:

- Continue Active Schools city wide Leeds PE and school sport partnership to secure full time funding for a School Game Organisers (SGO)
- Continue to participate in the Bramley Cluster partnership and School Sports Co-ordinator work in cluster to work alongside teachers to further develop their skills and expertise in the teaching of PE as well as developing assessment process in PE in line with the new National Curriculum.
- Continue with the Leeds United 'Partner Schools' Scheme to provide high quality provision
- Invest in new equipment to be used in lessons to encourage the least active and disengaged pupils in non- traditional sport

We will evaluate the impact of the Sports Premium funding as part of our normal self-evaluation arrangements. We will look at how well we use our Sport Premium to improve the quality and breadth of PE and sporting provision, including increasing participation in PE and sport so that all pupils develop healthy lifestyles and reach the performance levels they are capable of. We will look at pupil's progress in PE as well as other areas of development such as self-esteem, confidence and the numbers of pupils involved in sporting activities in and out of school. Assessments will be made both formally and informally using our school assessment systems as well as feedback from staff and visitors to the school. We will also evaluate the impact of professional development opportunities in improving teaching and learning in PE.
