What has been the impact on pupils' participation?	25 SEN children have participated in an extra-curricular activity and represented the school in competitive sport – they are Leeds champions. 100% of year 5&6 pupils took part in an external sporting event We have taken part in a record number of events.	
What has been the impact on pupils' attainment?	SEN are Leeds champions! Attainment in PE has increased with only 23% now assessed as BA in PE.	
How has the premium allowed pupils to develop active lifestyles?	More children are regularly taking part in PE and extra-curricular activities. Extra swimming has been offered to Year 6 children. The daily mile has seen full participation from KS2.	
How will the school sustain the improvements?	Changes made were long term changes that can be implemented again next year. We can use identified weaknesses from 2018-19 to further impact in 2019-2020. We have two PE leaders next year with a team focussed on Healthy lifestyles.
