There have been incidents where my child has been bullied by the same boy in her class and nothing really get done with him i believe alot of parents have the same issues with his boy
More range of after school activities for both boys and girls , we either don't get to hear of anything or there isn't anything going on to sign up for
Need to offer more after school activities to accommodate all children and all children need to be treated the same
I would like to receive more information about what they are learning at school, before covid I seem to recall term updates but since moving into YR2 not had anything. School clubs etc could be a KS2 thing rather than KS1, I'm unsure hence disagree statement
Every child should have a chance to do every activity. If it can't be offered to every child in class or year then it should not be offered at all. This would make it fair for all children. For example swimming and Ireland trips.
I feel that there needs to be a page on the school website that is easily accessible, which is dedicated to after school activities and clubs that are available. We have tried asking at reception however, it doesn't appear that anyone knows what clubs are available and we are always asked to await letters. Further to googling this along with the school name I was able to find a page which showed that there is a chess club and bouldering club. Can this page be made easier to access as I couldn't seem to find it by navigating through the school website. It would also be nice to see more clubs available for the children after school. The chess and bouldering clubs look great, but if there was more variety such as computer clubs, life skill clubs, self defense, music, art, games, cooking etc it would be fantastic!
Feel it is a little unfair that my child is not allowed swimming lessons because they can swim 25m. I get that it is a priority for other kids to learn, but feel they are being penalised for being able to swim.
We have been disappointed that there hasn't been much for parents in terms of school events, i.e. no school plays, sports day, photos. It's our son's 1st year of school and all the things we looked forward to experiencing we have not had the chance to do. Happy with his progress, behaviour and he is happy in school.
Would be nice for the teachers to actually be on the door in the morning so any issues can be raised, teaching assistants do say messages will be passed on but we have no idea if they actually are
Not enough information on handover regarding if a child's been on red etc. I'm having to 'trust' my 6 year old that they are telling me the truth to find out they were on red at some point of the week & then I have no idea why, don't think there is enough communication.
Q4: Not answered because child not bullied. Q12: I don't think I've heard of any subjects which are non standard therefore I'd assume there isn't a good range. Q13: I'd really like to hear about what clubs are offered. Perhaps the children are invited to clubs but the parents are unaware of them?
Faith is happy at school however I find it unsettling that her class will be changing next year as she is settled and do not want a change, furthermore I was very disappointed that there was no Christmas performance or sports day for reception and that the summer fair is on a Wednesday after school rather than a full day event at the weekend.

The only suggestion I will make is that since one of my children have been in nursery, I have noticed that the outside playing area is looking a bit 'run down' there hasn't been much change to the outdoor areas since my first child went to nursery back in 2016. Compared to other school nurseries in the Bramley area the Raynville nursery just needs a bit of an uplift doesn't look very appealing to new children or parents when you see old rotten pallets put together for a mud kitchen! and toys and other equipment looks dated and old just needs some investment to make it look nicer and welcoming. Other than that again it's a brilliant school and my children enjoy going to school.
