Our topic for the next half term is Take One Picture. We will be using artists' paintings to open a discussion about winter to see what the children already know and anything else they would like to find out! We will be exploring hot and cold, making snowmen crafts, comparing winter and summer, and having lots of winter stories. Fingers crossed and we may even get some snow!

Focus Activities

During this next half term we will continue with our small group activities. These will include some Phase One phonics activities, the children will learn to listen carefully and distinguish between familiar sounds.

We will be exploring size and learning the words to use when talking about size, e.g. bigger, biggest, smallest, shortest etc... we will also be learning to subitize, recognising a number of objects without needing to count.

In music we will be using the shakers we make to explore loud and quiet, fast and slow sounds.
